Introduction:

The course is organized for the Hong Kong Jockey Club Disaster Preparedness and Response Institute (HKJCDPRI) aiming to cultivate interest and create leaders in disaster management.

Key learning objectives:

- Framework of disaster response
- Issues overseas emergency medical teams (EMT) need to address
- World Health Organization's (WHO) specification on EMT
- What exactly can medical personnel offer in disasters
- Patterns of medical issues in different types of disasters
- Possible risks to EMT members at the scene
- Key elements in setting up field hospital, including WASH (water, sanitation and hygiene)
- Scene security
- Communication at the scene

Target audience:

Professionals in health care who wish to learn response in disasters.

Training Venue:

Hong Kong Academy of Medicine Jockey Club Building, Wong Chuk Hang, Hong Kong.

Course structure:

4 full days in 2018 (all Saturdays)

- 10th March
- 14th April
- 19th May
- 9th June

Course language:

English, optional to present in Cantonese when condition fits.

Successful completion criteria:

Minimum 75% attendance and passed the tests in the course.

Successful completion safeguard payment:

In order to safeguard commitment to complete the course, each selected applicant is required to submit a cheque of the sum HK\$3,000- made payable to the "Hong Kong College of Emergency Medicine" for enrollment. The cheques will be returned to students upon successful completion of the course. Cheque payment will be activated for students who fail to complete the course successfully.

- Lectures, small group discussions, demonstrations, experience sharings and tests.
