

## Highlights of Activities September 2018

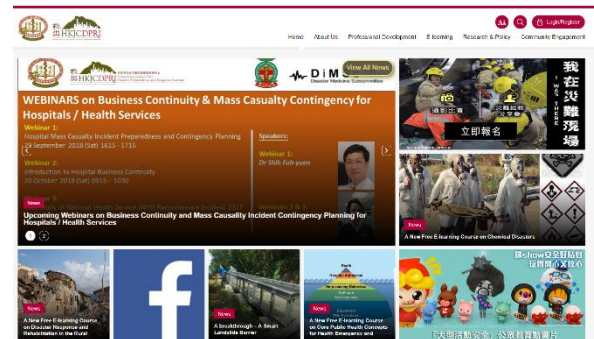
Dear Friends of HKJCDPRI,

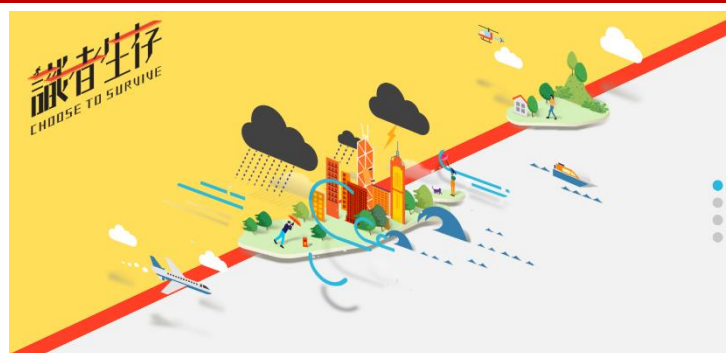
